- 01 A 28-year-old primigravida at 35 weeks of gestation is admitted with a history of head ache, vomiting and epigastric pain for four hours duration. Her blood pressure on admission was 180/110 mm Hg. Her antenatal period until now was uncomplicated.

 - Outline how you will further clinically assess her and mention your 1.1 (25 Marks) likely diagnosis.
 - 1.2 Briefly outline how you will further investigate her. (25 Marks)
 - 1.3 Mention how you will manage her condition pharmacologically and (25 Marks) give reasons.
 - 1.4 Mention two maternal and fetal complications each that can result (25 Marks) due to her condition
- 02 A 27-year-old para two presents to the antenatal clinic at 37 weeks of gestation. On examination her SFH was 36cm with breech presentation. An ultrasound scan confirmed this finding and the placental location was fundal with normal liquor volume and an estimated fetal weight of 3000g. Her first pregnancy was uncomplicated with a term vaginal delivery of a 3200g baby boy who is alive and well.
 - 2.1 Mention options of delivery of this fetus. (30 Marks)
 - 2.2 Describe how you would prepare this patient if she is keen on a (40 Marks) maneuver before delivery you mentioned in 2.1.
 - List four predisposing factors for breech presentation at term. (30 Marks)

A 30 year old nulliparous woman married for two years 03 presented to the subfertility clinic with a complaint of inability to conceive. On questioning she complained of severe cyclical abdominal pain during menstruation since the age of 26 and deep dyspareunia for two years.
